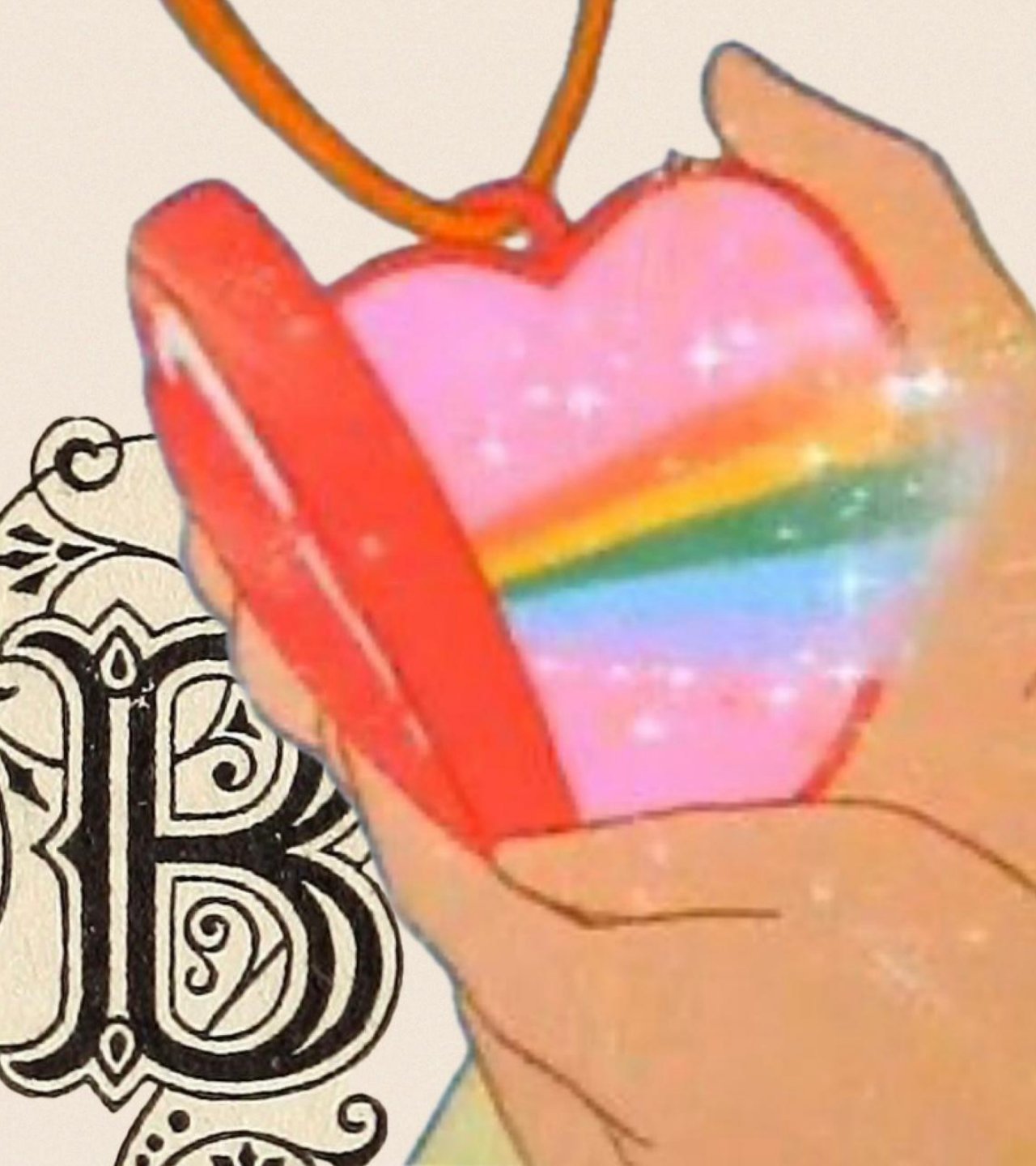




- ASEXUALITY -

A sexual orientation where a person experiences little to no sexual attraction to others.



- BISEXUALITY -

A sexual orientation where a person is attracted to both people of their own gender and other genders.



- CISGENDER -

A person whose gender identity aligns with the sex they were assigned at birth.



- DRAG -

Performing or dressing in clothing typically associated with the opposite gender, often for entertainment, self-expression, or activism.



- EMPOWERMENT -

The process of gaining confidence and control over one's life and identity, especially in marginalized communities.



- FEMME -

A gender expression often associated with femininity, sometimes used by queer women, nonbinary people, or anyone whose gender expression leans toward feminine.



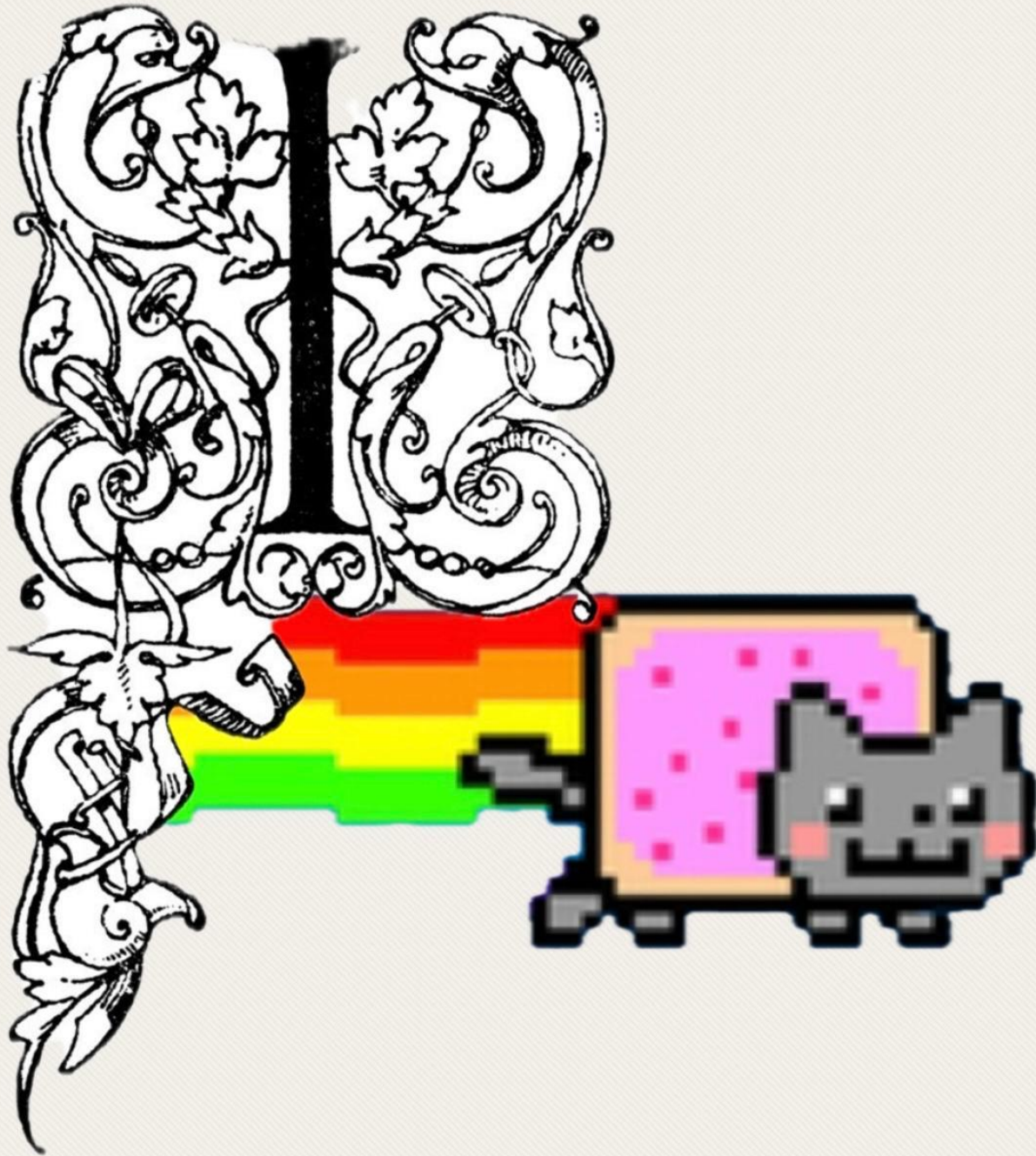
- GAY -

A sexual orientation used to describe someone attracted to individuals of the same gender, commonly used for men but can refer to anyone in the LGBTQ+ community.



- HETERONORMATIVITY -

The societal expectation or assumption that heterosexuality is the default or “normal” sexual orientation.



- INTERSEX -

A person born with
physical sex
characteristics that don't
fit typical definitions of
male or female.



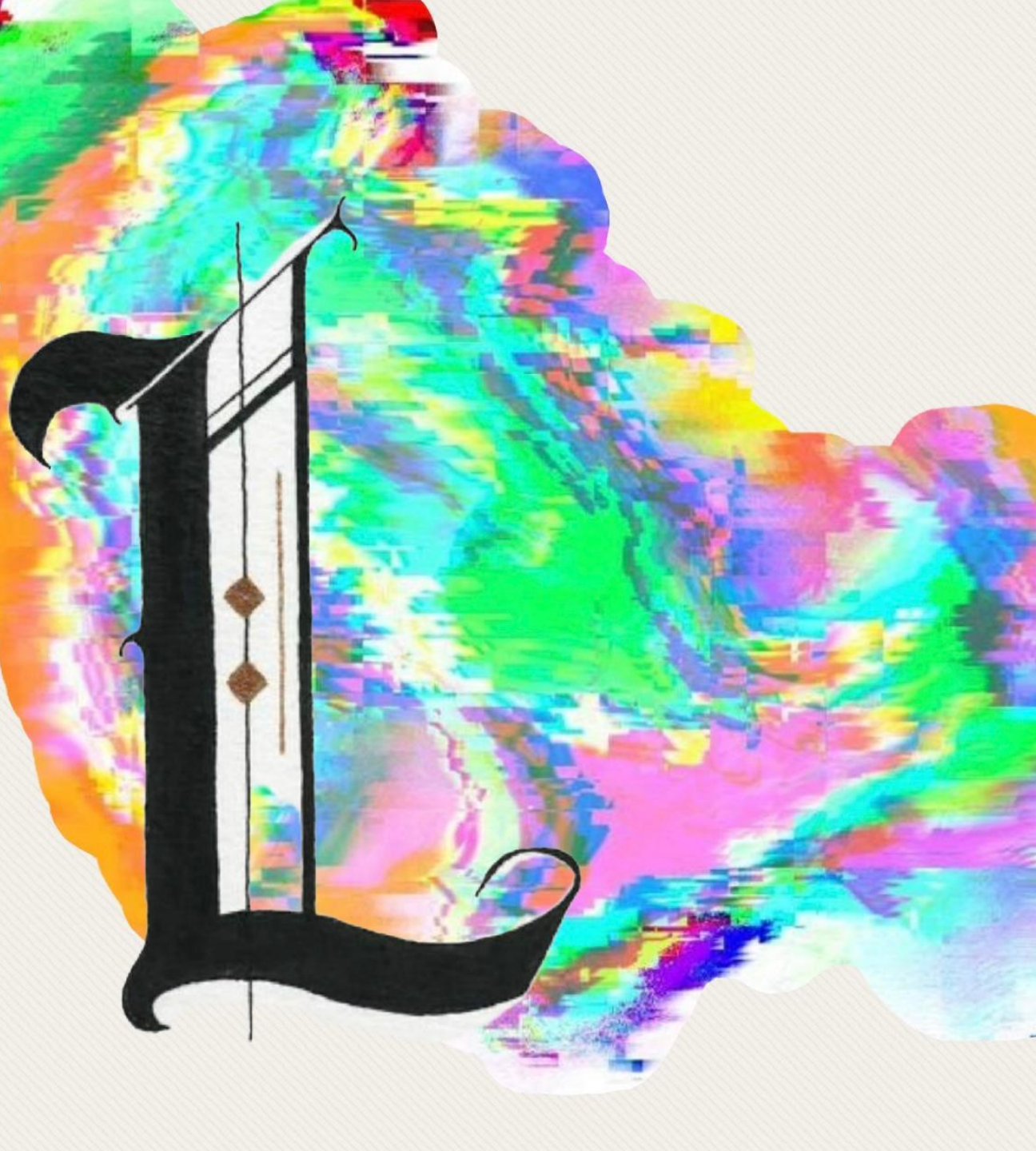
- Juxtaposition -

The contrast of diverse identities, expressions, and experiences within the queer community, highlighting diversity and intersectionality.



- KINSEY SCALE -

A scale from 0 to 6 that measures sexual orientation, showing that attraction can range from exclusively heterosexual to exclusively homosexual, with fluidity in between.



- LESBIAN -

A woman who is
attracted to other
women.



- MX. -

A gender-neutral
honorific used as an
alternative to “Mr.” or
“Ms.” for individuals
who don’t identify with
traditional gender titles.



- NON-BINARY-

A gender identity that does not fit strictly within the categories of “male” or “female.” Non-binary people may identify as both, neither, or a mix of genders.



- OMNISEXUALITY -

A sexual orientation where a person is attracted to all genders, similar to pansexuality, but with a focus on being attracted to people regardless of gender.



- TRANSGENDER -

A person whose gender identity differs from the sex they were assigned at birth. It is often shortened to “trans.”



- Y/YOUR GENDER -

A term used to emphasize
the importance of personal
agency in defining one's
own gender identity,
rejecting societal
impositions.
